**Trabuco Hills High School Thundering Mustangs Marching Unit from  
Mission Viejo, California to perform in  
2020 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade®**

**NEW YORK, NY & MISSION VIEJO, CA - MARCH 28, 2019** - Today, the Trabuco Hills High School Thundering Mustangs Marching Unit, from the Saddleback Valley Unified School District, was selected to perform in the 2020 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade®, representing the state of California. This will mark the first Parade appearance by the band. Trabuco Hills will join the Parade to the call of "Let's Have a Parade," the iconic phrase that has signaled the start of every Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade since 1924.

Each year, the Macy's Parade Band Committee looks for bands that have the stage presence, musical and marching abilities to captivate more than 3.5 million live spectators and more than 50 million viewers. Trabuco Hills was selected from more than 100 applicants as one of nine selected bands to march in the 94<sup>th</sup> edition of the annual holiday spectacle. The band will join the revelry along with other iconic Macy's staples: floats, giant character balloons, clowns and superstar performers galore on Thanksgiving Day 2020, helping to create an unforgettable experience for millions.

"Establishing themselves as one of the premiere units in the state of California, the Trabuco Hills High School Thundering Mustangs consistently deliver exciting, highly-theatrical performances year after year on the marching field," said Wesley Whatley, Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade creative producer. "We look forward to welcoming this accomplished group of students to the streets of New York City for their debut performance in the 2020 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade!"
