### WELCOME PACKET LIST

Dear Instrumental Music Students and Families:

Welcome to another exciting year of the Trabuco Hills High School (THHS) Instrumental Music Program! Listed below are the key music program participation information and forms to be reviewed, completed and returned to the music program for the 2024-2025 school year.

- 1. <u>Student Information Form</u> Please complete this form <u>online</u>, so we can maintain a master roster for the Trabuco Hills High School Instrumental Music Program.
- 2. Pre-Participation Physical Examination Form and online Athletic Clearance All members of the Thundering Mustangs Marching Unit (band/drumline/guard) are required to complete the physical examination screening and submit the information online through the <u>AthleticClearance.com</u> website prior to the first day of Rookie Band Camp and Band Camp. See Flyer for further instructions. Note, this is a two-step process (i.e., visit a physician for the evaluation and submit results online), so we recommend that you address this item as quickly as possible. The Orchestra, Jazz Ensemble and Symphonic Band only students are not required to complete the form.
- 3. **SVUSD Athletic Information Form** This is the school district's emergency contact form (MANDATORY).
- 4. Equipment Usage Form This is a contract between the school and the student when an instrument is loaned to a student. THHS provides large instruments, percussion equipment, guard equipment, and smaller instruments on a limited basis. All other items, such as valve oil, slide grease, reeds, mouthpieces, etc. are the responsibility of the students to gather and have available.
- 5. <u>Summer Camp Information</u> This document provides details of Rookie Band Camp, Band Camp, and Orchestra Camp dates. These summer camps are required for all members of the Marching Unit and Orchestra Ensemble.
- 6. <u>Bingo Fundraiser</u> To remain competitive and be a successful program, some additional fundraising is necessary to supplement the amounts allocated by the school district. Bingo is a major fundraising activity, and we would like to continue raising the importance of this fundraiser for the THHS music programs. The funds raised through Bingo help to defray costs for all ensembles including String Orchestra, Jazz Ensemble, Symphonic Band, Percussion Ensemble, Color Guard and the Thundering Mustangs Marching Unit. This fundraiser is not only vital to the financial health of the music boosters, but also to the quality of the music education and experience for each student. We kindly request for your support by having parents within the music program work at least one Bingo shift per month. Bingo takes place every Thursday evening year-round. Set up, concession, game sales, and clean up are just a few ways that you support at Bingo. SignUp can be found on the https://thhsmusic.com.
- 7. <u>Program Costs & Ensemble Contributions</u> This is an overall summary of the cost per member to participate in the different ensembles. Further details of the costs for each ensemble with and without fundraising can be found on Exhibit A.
- 8. <u>Schedule of Ensemble Contribution & Costs</u> A summary and form of the costs to be a member per ensembles within the Trabuco Hills High School Instrumental Music Program.
- 9. First Day of Camp Checklist a list of items students must have when they show up to camp.
- 10. <u>Spiritwear and Concert Attire</u> Students from all ensembles are required to wear blue THHS Instrumental Music Program polo shirts at all events when not in uniform. The polo shirts cost \$30 each. All spiritwear can be ordered online through a local vendor called "Designs That Fit." NOTE: The first football game at which the Marching Unit will be performing is on **Fri, Sep 13, 2024**, where blue polo shirts will be mandatory.

### **BINGO FUNDRAISER**

#### OVERVIEW

On an annual basis, the Saddleback Valley Unified School District (SVUSD) allocates funding provided by the state for co-curricular activities to all schools in our district, including Trabuco Hills High School (THHS). THHS faculty then allocates these funds from the district amongst the various co-curricular activities at the school, such as athletics and sports, academic clubs, performing arts, visual arts, hobby clubs, leadership and service clubs, and many other programs. Due to the increasing competition for these same funds, the amount allocated to the Instrumental Music program is often a very limited amount. Many of the important and impactful activities that are needed to help shape our band students and to give the students a robust music experience are often not fully covered by the allocated funds. Furthermore, the costs of festivals, concerts, competitions, performance events, transportation to/from events, experienced coaches, family potlucks, year-end awards dinner and so many other activities are often at-risk of being cut due to the limited funds.

To help cover costs, the THHS Instrumental Music Program has needed to raise funds through requests for donations, selling program advertisements to local businesses, and sponsoring various fundraising activities. The music program Ways and Means Committee has a list of all fundraising activities the music program has used to help raise funds. One of the largest and most important fundraisers is/has been the Bingo Fundraiser. Due to the size of the activities for this fundraiser alone, it warrants a dedicated Booster VP. As a percent of total dollars brought in, the Bingo Fundraiser is at the top of the list.

#### Fun Facts about Bingo at THHS:

- 2024-2025 season will be our 14th Anniversary with the Bingo fundraising.
- Bingo is <u>exclusive</u> to the Instrumental Music program; all profits support the music program.
- Funds from Bingo support ALL ensembles, including the Marching Unit, Orchestra, Symphonic Band, Jazz Ensemble, Winter Guard, and Winter Drumline.
- Bingo and the other fundraiser activities help lower the Parent Contributions by ~35%.
- Bingo at THHS is one of the most popular bingo halls in Orange County! Reference: Yelp: Bingo Halls (2024).
- This is serious BINGO! Payouts range from \$250 \$1,199.
- More than 75 regular players show up every Thursday.

#### Dates: Thursday evenings year-round

Times: Set-up begins at 3:30 PM. Bingo play begins at 6:00 PM until 9:00 PM. Clean-up 9:00 PM to 10:00 PM.

#### Your involvement and support of Bingo means a lot to our students and music program:

The Instrumental Music Program kindly requests that each ensemble member's parents and friends help support this great fundraiser on Thursday evenings. There are three distinct areas and times when support is most needed: during set-up, play time, and clean-up at the end. The set-up phase help entails helping set up the player tables and chairs, the buy-in table, the hospitality stand, the game caller's table, pre-package the games for the evening, and other minor tasks as needed. The play time phase support includes helping with the pull tab tables, sellers walking the room selling the games, maintaining the hospitality stand, and supporting players with various needs they may have. The clean-up phase support includes putting away the tables and chairs, the caller's table, closing the hospitality stand, collecting trash, and tidying up the multi-purpose room. A successful Bingo night usually requires a minimum of 30 members and a lot of teamwork to support the event. Parents can choose to stay the whole evening or arrive to help in a specific area and/or cover a specific shift timeslot.

Keep in mind, this fundraiser is <u>exclusive</u> to the Instrumental Music program and there are many other cocurricular programs at the school who would love to take over the Bingo fundraiser for their own fundraising. ### **PROGRAM COSTS & ENSEMBLE CONTRIBUTIONS**

#### OVERVIEW

The Saddleback Valley Unified School District (SVUSD) is very proud of the extensive co-curricular programs offered at our comprehensive high schools. Through state funding, the school district provides financial support for these programs to cover direct costs, some stipends for the coaches and advisors for each of the programs, general facilities upkeep and maintenance, transportation of students to and from events, small amounts for equipment repairs, etc. However, costs often exceed the limited state allocated funds, thus necessitating the booster club support and requests for contributions from participants.

Participation in the Trabuco Hills High School (THHS) Instrumental Music Boosters Organization is strictly voluntary. No student will be denied the opportunity to participate in a SVUSD co-curricular activity, because of a parent or guardian's inability to participate in fundraising activities, failure to devote time or resources to the booster club, or inability to purchase uniforms, accessories and equipment. Parents or students who do not participate will not be publicly identified.

#### Highlights of some of the Major Activity Costs (Unfunded):

- 1. Marching Unit Trip WBA Championships, Fresno/Clovis 3-day, 2-night trip in Fall 2024
- 2. Jazz Ensemble Trip (tentative) Heritage Festival, San Diego 2-day, 1-night trip in Spring 2025

#### **ENSEMBLE CONTRIBUTIONS:**

After reviewing all funding and proposed spending in 2024-2025, the Instrumental Music program finds the need to reach out to all music program participants for contributions to help supplement the unfunded costs. The contribution amounts are adjusted to ensemble size, planned 2024-2025 activities for all ensembles and, in general, year-over-year cost increases. Below is a quick summary of the proposed contributions costs. See Exhibit A for additional cost details for each ensemble.
